Gift-Giving for All!

Gift-giving is easy when we know the recipient's likes and dislikes. For those who are blind or visually impaired, understanding their visual acuity is key. Can they read large print, see light, or are they totally blind? These insights help in choosing the perfect gift.

My top five gift recommendations for 2025 are as follows:

- 1. The new Blind Barbie, purchase from:

 Barbie 12.7" Fashionistas Doll Brown Hair/brown Eyes

 Blind Doll Wearing Pastel Outfit With Cane And

 Sunglasses: Target or Amazon.com: Barbie Fashionistas

 Doll #228, Blind Doll Wearing Pink Top and Ruffled Skirt

 with Cane and Sunglasses in Partnership with The

 American Foundation for The Blind: Toys & Games

 I received one from my mom and absolutely love it. We both believe that this item could be a useful toy for young children, as well as an educational tool for older kids, teenagers, and even adults. This item came out last year.
- 2. Apple products, such as the new iPhone 17 Pro or a new Apple Watch, can be purchased at http://www.apple.com/store. The great news with devices like these is that they all offer built-in accessibility features, such as VoiceOver for users who are blind or have very low vision, like myself. There is also Zoom (not to be confused with the online meeting platform), which allows the user to magnify content. Speaking of magnification, the iPhone and iPad also have a standalone Magnifier app, which makes use of the device's camera to make objects larger to help low vision users see them. Devices such as the iPhone 17 Pro, also come equipped with lidar. This allows the user to detect doors and other objects,

using only their phone. If they do come upon a door and this feature is in use, VoiceOver will tell them how to operate the door. For example, they may hear, "Turn the knob." This feature has improved my independence, and I hope it does the same for whoever is receiving this device this holiday season.

- 3. For the podcaster or audio enthusiast in your life, I recommend the Zoom H1 Essential recorder. As long as the item title contains the word "essential," these devices speak every menu item. You can purchase one from www.zoomcorp.com or AT Guys and this item typically runs between \$99 and \$350. At the time of this writing, the file list is not accessible on the device by the accessibility feature, but that can easily be worked around by plugging it into your computer using a USB-C converter. You can also use this cable to connect to your iPhone or iPad and record using the recorder as your mic. Plus, you can manage files via the files app.
- 4. For the person in your life who is enthusiastic about Braille and also needs to take notes for work or school, the BrailleSense 6 would be my recommendation. I received one in February and absolutely love it! This device runs Android 12, and the firmware is updated frequently. Learn more and purchase from https://selvasblv.com/product/braillesense-6/.

The firmware on these devices was just upgraded to version 3.0 and, while it does not upgrade the Android version any further, there are some much-needed improvements, such as the ability to create outlines using the Word Processor.

5. If the person you're buying for happens to be a ham radio operator like myself, the radio I recommend is the TH-D75A, which can be purchased from https://www.kenwood.com/usa/com/amateur/th-d75a/ for \$699.
